- I. The Preview of the Jabez Blessing

"And Jabez called on the God of Israel saying, "Oh, that you would bless me indeed!" So God granted him what he requested. 1 Chronicles 4:10

A. The Description of the Jabez Blessing

- 1. "Bless" means to bestow favor or KINDNESS.
- 2. "Indeed" carries the meaning of greatly or **INTENSELY.**

B. The Distinctives of the Jabez Blessing

- 1. The Blessing is not impersonal but it's personal.
- 2. The Blessing is not specific but it's general.
- 3. The Blessing is not directed by man but **God.**
- 4. The Blessing is not meager but abundant.
- 5. The Blessing is not a weak wish but a fervant **desire**.

And Jabez called on the God of Israel, saying,

"Oh, that YOU would bless me indeed, and enlarge my territory, that your hand would be with me, and that you would keep me from evil, that I may not cause pain."

And God granted him what he requested.

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II. The Pitfalls of the Jabez Blessing

Misconception #1: It always works - just say the words! The Prayer of Jabez is not **MAGIC**.

Misconception #2: I can't pray Jabez - it's not right to pray for myself! The Prayer of Jabez is not **SELFISH**.

Misconception #3: If you want to get rich, pray Jabez! The Prayer of Jabez is not **PROSPERITY GOSPEL.**

The kind of radical trust in God's good intentions toward us has nothing in common with the popular gospel that you should ask God for a Cadillac, a six-figure income, or some other material sign that you have found a way to cash in on your connection with him. The Prayer of Jabez, page 24.
